COURSE DESCRIPTIONS- PCA Fair January 2017

<u>ACV (AUX Communications Vehicle) Qualifications:</u> This vehicle is a multi-use/mission vehicle that can be used as a PA Display and Recruiting tool, or as a Communication Center with the capability of functioning independently in remote locations.



In this class you will learn the vehicle's capabilities and see its

potential for the Auxiliary. The training for the PQS for basic use will be reviewed in this class so you will be able to drive and use this vehicle at local events. This session will not have detailed training for the specific data and remote communication capabilities.

ATON PQS: This workshop is designed to get you ready for the Aids to Navigation PQS sign off with the Qualification Verifying Officer. Prerequisites: Download and bring the *"Auxiliary Aid to Navigation (ATON) Verifier"* PQS sign-off booklet, found at http://ns.dllnuscgaux.info/ns.html. AUX Chef (2-day course): WANTED... A few good cooks! The Aux Chef (FS) class will provide the experienced or novice Auxiliarist with the desire to cook for the USCG, the opportunity to learn the basics of cooking, sanitation and workings of a Coast Guard galley. The AuxFS program is a direct operation support mission that helps relieve the Coast Guard Food Service cooks at small boat stations or on cutters to allow them time for other tasks, training and leave. Once the class is completed you will have to complete the PQS by getting signed off by a Coast Guard FS or qualified AuxFS.

This is a hands-on and classroom program. To become an AUX Chef, members must complete a short medical
evaluation and obtain a Hepatitis A immunization. Please contact the instructor for more information-

AUXSEA: The Auxiliary Seamanship Specialty course is designed to present the Auxiliarist with a thorough knowledge of vessels and proficiency in their operation. An AUXSEA Specialist has extensive knowledge of how vessels are constructed and operated. The AUXSEA Specialist understands marine engines, how to perform minor repairs, is knowledgeable about vessel handling and knows how to approach distress situations. You can achieve success as an AUXSEA Specialist by passing a proctored examination with a score of 75% or better. The exam will be offered (paper version or on-line) at the end of class.

Boat Crew/Surface Ops Academy: This is an all-new, 2-day course designed to be a great prep for those interested in/thinking about obtaining their Boat Crew or Coxswain certification. Taught by our OTO, QEs, and experienced coxswain and crew, there will be didactic portions, followed by practice and PQS task sign-offs. Don't miss this great prep for all who are planning to complete their check ride at an OPTREX in 2016! *Instructors: BOSN4 Doug Leavell (OTO), COMO Angelo Perata (QE Coordinator), various QEs, Coxswains and seasoned Boat Crew*

<u>Chart Update Training 101:</u> This workshop is designed for all members wishing to assist NOAA-NOS & USCG in keeping our charts updated and Coast Pilot accurate for the boating public. The instructor will be covering Nautical Chart updating, Small Craft Facility updating, Coast Pilot updating, and how to report your findings. Coastie: Coastie is an animated robotic cartoon character in appearance, and is very mobile. He has navigation and searchlights, a rotating beacon, a siren, an air horn, and eyes and eyelids that move meaningfully. He talks, plays music, and interacts with the instructor and the children during the presentation. Coastie teaches rules about what to do and not do in a water emergency situation. For instance, Coastie teaches "Reach or Throw But Never Go In". This class is mandatory if you would like to use "Coastie" at boat shows, parades, or your PA events; or if you will be trailering Coastie to events.

If you haven't taken a Coastie course in the past two years, you need to come back for additional instruction and changes to the program and Coastie/trailer operations. *Instructor: Phil Grove, DSO-VE*

<u>Communications Roundtable:</u> If you are working within the AUX Comms program, this is a great opportunity for you. This roundtable is offered by our District Communications staff, and will include topics such as: radio texting, OPTREX-CERT drills, Spectrum Management, VHF net and Digital. The group will discuss issues and solutions within the Comms community and expectations of the Comms chain of management. *Instructors: Robert Vanderhyde, DSO-CM and the District 11N AUX Comm staff*

DCDR Training (Mandatory): This course is mandatory for all 2017 Division Commanders. Vice Division Commanders are welcome to attend. Topics to include: "Go to Web", format and information to be included in monthly reports, District goals, etc. **Instructors: members of EXCOM**

Diversity: A Key Part of Building Recruitment, Involvement and Retention: This session will be used to introduce and discuss proven ways to apply Coast Guard Standards for Diversity to be more effective in the major functional elements of Flotilla operations. We will be reviewing the application process for the NACO 3-Star Award for Excellence in Diversity so that any representative from a Flotilla or Division can learn the process. From that point on, the instructor will be ready to answer any questions to make sure that the application is successful. *Instructor: Tim Kahn, DSO-Diversity*

Dockwalkers: Learn about potential sources of boat pollution and their impact, federal and state environmental boating regulations for boaters, and clean boating practices that prevent pollution from boating. This program will provide you with educational resources (boater kit) and information for working with boaters. The Dockwalker program is consistent with the Coast Guard marine environmental pollution message and fulfills your commitment to carry out the mandate of the Commandant of the Coast Guard. The Dockwalker program complements the USCGAUX Vessel Examination program, supports Public Affairs/Public Education events, and counts towards the annual Marine Safety service requirement for the TRIDENT program. Hours of Dockwalking may count towards earning the Aux Recreational Boating Safety Insignia. *Instructor: Vivian Matuk, California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways and California Coastal Commission.*

<u>Fleet Week Shore-side Volunteer Training Class</u>: This class is for all Auxiliarists who are interested in finding out what it takes to be a volunteer for shore-side duty during Fleet Week. Auxiliary volunteers are heavily relied upon to help insure the success of this major public event. We have the primary role in managing the long lines of visitors to the docked ships. Last year we interacted with more than 300,000 members of the public. We act as eyes and ears, playing a key part in ensuring the public have a safe, enjoyable visit when touring the Fleet. We represent the Coast Guard to the public in what is one of the largest PA/PR activities held in the country.

This class will cover communicating with the public, including what you can and can't talk about; what to do in the event of an emergency; military courtesy; proper wearing of uniforms and more. Come learn what this is all about and decide if you want to participate in what will likely be the most enjoyable duty you will have in the Auxiliary. **Instructors: Gary Kaplan & Michael Brown**

<u>GIMP- Free Photo Editing Software:</u> There's no question that Adobe Photoshop is excellent image editing software. But for those of us that can't afford the cost and don't want to pay \$20 per month just to use it, there is GIMP. GIMP has become the preferred software for photo & image editing among more professionals than ever. The GNU Image Manipulation Program is the standard photo-editing tool. While photo-editing professionals may sneer at GIMP, the program has more than enough capabilities for the average person editing snapshots at home. This class will get you started in the world of GIMP. We will crop, add and remove things from a photo, look into some artistic tricks. This class will be a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) if you want to have hands on ability, but it's not required. You will need to have installed GIMP before class. Hazwhoper: This 4-hour training is designed to meet the requirements of CFR 1910.120(q), the Hazwoper regulation, for EMERGENCY RESPONSE to a potential or actual release of hazardous substances or a discharge of oil. Provides an understanding of what hazardous substances are, and the risks associated with them. Understand your role in the response plan. *Instructor: Wil Sumner, DCAPT*

ICS 300: "Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents", or ICS-300, is the FEMA course usually required when responding to multi-day incidents like the Valley Fire. ICS-300 provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the ICS. The course expands upon information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. Students taking ICS 300 must have completed ICS 100, 200, 700 and 800. Please bring proof to class. Topics include:

- Describe how the NIMS command and management component supports the management of expanding incidents.
- Describe the incident or event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by ICS.
- Implement the incident management process in a simulated Type 3 incident.
- Develop an incident action plan for a simulated incident.

NOTE: In lieu of meeting Friday evening, the instructor will assign pre-reading that must be completed before class on Saturday. You must attend the course in its entirety to receive credit. There is a \$20 fee for this class. Please make your check payable to "Bruce Martin" and bring with you to class. *Instructor: Bruce Martin, DSO-IM*

<u>Mandatory Courses</u>: If you have been putting off completing the required "mandatory" courses, or have had trouble finding them online, then now is your opportunity! An experienced instructor will demonstrate how to log on, then provide instructor led course for each of the required/mandatory courses. Different topics/required courses will be offered each day, such that if you attend both sessions you will complete all the mandatory courses. *Instructors: various*

MEES (Marine Safety- Prevention Outreach Specialist): This course will provide an overview and the materials required for one of the new Performance Qualification Standards (PQS) for the Marine Safety Program. To complete the PQS the member must be a qualified Instructor, complete the on line FEMA EMI course IS-5 (Hazardous Materials), the online IMSEP, and the on line Good Mate Course. *Instructor: Sue Fry, DSO-MS*

<u>New Member Academy</u>: A "must" course for new Auxiliarists! Includes discussions about uniforms, protocols, Auxiliary offices, opportunities, DIRAUX, Chain of Leadership and other topics. The course will include a tour of the Island, and a cutter if in port. *Instructors: Rick and Georgieanna Scheuerman*

PowerPoint: Avoid Death by PowerPoint: The main purpose of this class will be to show you what you can do with presentation software. What you should do is a whole different story that what you can do. It is often said that style is a personal issue, however, in the case of presentations, legibility comes fist and should never be sacrificed for the sake of the presenter's artistic fantasies.

This class is a BYOD (bring your own device) if you want to have a hands-on experience, but it is not required. *Instructor: Mart Gardner, DSO-CS*

<u>Proctored Exams</u>: Having difficulty finding someone to proctor an exam for you? Ready to take NavRules, or any another exam? This is your opportunity! You tell us which exam, and pick a day/time, and we will provide the proctor in the DIRAUX office. *Instructors: DIRAUX Staff*

Program Visitor: The primary purpose of the RBS Visitation Program is to establish Program Partners (marine dealers, bait shops, etc), in local areas and visit them on a regular basis. The Program Visits inform Program Partners of the Coast Guard's Recreational Boating Safety program and the applicable federal, state, and local safety requirements. While doing so, the Program Visitor has the opportunity to clarify safety issues, promote safe boating education, and to promote the Vessel Safety Check program.

Consider joining the District 11N RBS Program Visitation team! This course will provide information about the program, how to obtain display supplies, and submitting the appropriate documentation. The qualification exam will be provided at the end of the class. After the class, students will need to be proctored for one visit.

<u>Team Coordination Training (TCT)</u>: Team Coordination Training (TCT) is a program that focuses on reducing the probability for human error by increasing individual and team effectiveness. Required to participate in all Operational activities, and recommended for all Auxiliarists. Must be renewed every 5 years for Operations, and annually for AuxChef. Be sure to check your due date for this important class. *Instructor: Bob Coackley*

<u>Uninspected Passenger Vessel Examiner</u>: Intended for all current and form VE's, this class will cover topics in preparation for completing the PQS:

- regulatory requirements for examinations for vessels under 65'
- additional safety equipment needed for the 5-Star Program
- examiner's verification of basic safety equipment
- ePIRBS, pumps, high level alarms and fire extinguisher requirements
- education of operator for carriage requirements for 6-pack operations
- outreach to operators for volunteer compliance

Copies of the current PQS will be available for signoffs.

<u>Vessel Examiner (1-day course)</u>: The Vessel Examiner (VE) course at the Past Captain's Training Fair (PCA) by design, is a FULL 1-day class. It is presented with the new member in mind to help enhance understanding of the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) that is not provided when simply reading the manual and attempting the on-line examination. All information provided assists in passing the on-line 35-question examination.

Other than being a member in at least AP status and a pre-class 1-hour review of the VSC Manual, there are no prerequisites. The Sunday class commences PROMPLY at 0730 and concludes approximately 1600. The presentation is light and filled with actual instructor VSC experiences to help enhance the student understanding of the VSC and is packed with information not only about the VSC, but also Facility Inspections.

In addition to a thorough review of the VSC Manual in preparation for the online exam, there is a 15-minute video of a VSC, and several power–point presentations. In addition, many forms and handouts are provided to assist the student in creating a successful VSC program. When the member passes the on-line exam, their results will be automatically entered into AUXDATA. After taking the course and passing the examination the member is well prepared to perform at least 5 VSC's under the guidance of a mentor." *Instructor: Phil Grove, DSO-VE*
