<u>Cold Water Immersion</u> (CWI) can be immediately life threatening long before the dangers of hypothermia set in. This class will discuss the four phases of the body's response to CWI, as well as how to be prepared to survive CWI yourself or to assist in the rescue of others during this potentially life threating situation. The class will present an actual Auxiliary Patrol CWI scenario.
