HAZWHOPER AWARENESS: Wil Sumner - Virtually w "potentially" onsite ASC Sue Fry - Deputy, and Joseph Chavoen DSO-MS	The 4 hour HAZWHOPER Awareness Course meets the requirements outlined in osha 29 CFR 1910.110 for the 4 (four) hours of annual refresher training for those who may come across an oil spill, or other hazardous materials in their work environment, and how to avoid exposure to these situations. This class is recommended for all Operations Personnel and how to respond to an oils spill or mystery drum.
INTRODUCTION TO MARINE SAFETY D11N Joseph Chavoen DSO-MS, (with potentially others)	This course covers the various MEP Outreach Programs as well as the Marine Safety Prevention and Response activities within District 1 North and is for All Auxiliary Members who would like to learn of the wide breadth of Opportunities for and Certifications within Marine Safety. These impart include AWW, Dock Walker and Sea Partners Outreach Mission for the Public. The presentation covers the support for CG Sector San Francisco Prevention and Response (each requires a PQS) including but not limited to; Uninspected Passenger Vessels, Commercial Fishing Vessels, Facility and Container Exams, Unispec. Towing Vessel Exams, Pacific Strike Team. IMD (ADV & HAZWHOPER), to name a few. The intent of this brief course is to provide a brief overview of the numerous opportunities for involvement within the Marine Safety and Environmental Protection Division of the Prevention Department and in cases the Response Department.
Radio Communications – Boat Crew Como Wally Smith (1 hour)	Overview of VHF-FM radio procedures and protocols for boat crew. When you are "out there" on an ordered patrol or just boating recreationally, what are the proper procedures and protocol for telecommunication via radio? This class includes proper procedures for communicating with other vessels or your "radio guard", use of "pro words", phonetics, and importantly the "Do's" and "Do Nots". Also reviews limitations of VHF-FM radio transmissions and includes an overview of the Rescue 21 system. A must class for coxswains, boat crew, and trainees prior to getting back underway this boating season.
Aviation Operations Larry Olsen, DSO-AV	This course will explain how to get involved in the Auxiliary Aviation Program, including the training and other requirements necessary for you to become qualified as Air Observer, Aircrew or Pilot. It will also provide an overview of Aux Aviation, the types of missions we are involved in and how they are integrated into surface and land-mobile operations.
