***HAZWOPER (HAZardous Waste OPerations and Emergency Response)- First Responder**

This course is designed to teach first responders what to do during the initial phases of an oil discharge or hazardous chemical release. It will teach participants how to recognize, evaluate, and control hazards in the workplace. This course stresses safety and knowing your limitations as a first responder when oil or hazardous chemicals come into play during response evolutions and SAR cases. Topics covered will include Laws and Regulations, Material Safety Data Sheets, and Personal Protective Equipment, and possibly even some videos that stress the need for maintaining situational awareness. Following the training, there will be some hands-on exercises with containment boom.
